Serenity vs. Classic

From time to time, customers ask us to explain the differences between the Serenity and Classic models. Following is a comparison of the two:

Similarities: Both the Classic and Serenity Models are made of Western Red Cedar #2 Grade. Both are handmade in Pennsylvania at the same shop by the same skilled carpenters. They both feature the same 2x6 rafters, the same double 2x8 half-moon corner braces, the same steel post brackets, and the same options.

Differences: The differences between the Classic and Serenity models are as follows:

^{*} We fashion a notch at every point where the 2x4 top runners touch the 2x6 rafters, and we pre-assemble the beam assemblies for you.

Comments: Neither model is better than the other. The main difference is aesthetic. In other words, they simply look different. Some people like the way the Classic looks more than the Serenity. Others like the Serenity more than the Classic. See accompanying photos on the page below.

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
